Kirrang Newsletter Term 1 2024



What a busy term we have had in Kirrang. We started the term by welcoming Ms Rhiki to Richardson. We have presented at Assembly, ran the Cross Country course, paraded our Easter Hats and this week celebrated our learning with our families.



<u>InitiaLit</u>

Our Literacy program is taught through the InitiaLit program. This program focuses on developing and mastering the necessary skills needed for reading. Students in Kirrang continue their learning in InitiaLit 1 and consolidate and explore grammar and further spelling features through IntiaLit 2.

<u>Maths</u>



This term we have been focusing on numbers, by investigating their order and place value. We use lots of different hands on materials including, number charts, unifix blocks, and MAB blocks to explore concepts. We have begun to explore addition by identifying the parts and the whole of a number sentence. We investigated sets and different

combinations, that then led us into recalling number facts to 10 and 20 (friends of 10); doubles and identifying turn around facts. We also investigated some different types of graphs and learnt how to record results using tally marks.





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Let's Appreciate our Food (Unit of Inquiry)

This term, we have been investigating where our food comes from. We made bread and explored the ingredients in Mac and Cheese. Alira and Kate presented their learning about eating different kinds of foods – the colours of the rainbow. Auntie Barb also came in to share with us how Indigenous people use their environment as a food source.
