This week the nurses from the Kindergarten Health Check team came to Richardson. Our kindergarten children had their hearing, sight and growth assessed. Families will be contacted if there are any concerns.

On Wednesday the school participated in National Simultaneous Storytime. This event is held annually and aims to promote the value and enjoyment of reading. Every year a picture book which is written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator is read simultaneously in libraries, childcare centres, preschools, schools, bookshops, and family homes. # Provide a Safe, Inclusive, and Respectful School Culture

This Sunday 26 May is National Sorry Day, a time when we remember and acknowledge the mistreatment of the Indigenous people of Australia. This day gives people the chance to come together and share the steps towards healing for the Stolen Generations, their families and communities. Monday 27 May is Reconciliation Day, a public holiday and a time to reflect on our shared history and healing journey.

Next Wednesday we will welcome Constable Kenny Koala from ACT Policing. Kenny will be working with students from preschool, kindergarten, year 1 and 2 on staying safe in the community. This visit supports learning in the areas of personal and social understanding, and health and physical education.

Our Koori Preschool have been venturing to Namadgi to learn on Country since last term. Each fortnight, the children have the opportunity to be on Country, learning from the land and understanding their connection to the land. In week

8 and 10, we will be inviting all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from years 3 to 6 to join the preschool children as mentors and guides. 

In maths we have been collecting data and making graphs. We used counters, rolls of the dice, pictures of our favoutire friut and leaves from the playground to create our graphs.
















We have also been counting objects in our environment to reinforce our understanding of numbers to 10.











The Kindergarten Turtles enjoyed going outside to look at the way the leaves changed colour in Autumn. They drew some amazing Autumn trees.










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# 2024 school year enrolment reminder

### Dear Parents & Carers

The School Board is writing to give you information about Voluntary Contributions. Donations from families are an important way to raise money for our school. A request for a Voluntary Contribution is no more than a request to help our school.

#### Why does the School Board Request Voluntary Contributions?

Each school is given an allocation of money from the ACT Government and this is linked to enrolment numbers. This money is carefully budgeted by the School to pay the costs for running the school such as the electricity, water, sewerage, maintenance, resources for all teaching units, photocopying, portage, IT and all operating costs. While funding it adequate for most of the school's basic needs, there are always other important items, which are needed to enhance the learning programs. Such as targeted teaching resources, sporting equipment and books for children linked to support the schools priorities. From time to time there are also unexpected expenses, which need to be met from the school budget.



#### How much in 2023

For 2023 the School Board has suggested an amount of \$60 per family. This is a suggestion only and other options are available.
