Dear Parents and Carers,

We have reached the halfway point of term one. It has been wonderful to watch so much happening at school, I've particularly enjoyed seeing families back in school and connecting with staff and students in a lovely positive way.

Improve learning and achievement for all students

Kindergarten students have completed their BASE testing for the beginning of the year. BASE is conducted at the beginning of the year and the end. It provides teachers with information about students' literacy, numeracy, communication and language, and personal social and emotional development.

K-2 classes have completed their screening for InitiaLit and are now into the second phase of the assessments that ensure we are meeting students at their point of need. InitiaLit is an evidence-based whole-class literacy program providing all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers.

Years 3 and 5 will be sitting NAPLAN between 13-25 March. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar, and punctuation) and numeracy. Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some familiarisation and explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance. We do not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of coaching services.

Koori Preschool have begun their 'On Country' learning. They began by having a visit to the local area close to school. They will be taking a bus to Namadji National Park next week.

1/2 classes are looking at history of transport and Mrs Hogan has organised a vintage car group to visit the school next week. So if you notice witches hats out in the car park we ask that you leave space for our visitors.

Develop an expert teaching team

The whole school staff, teachers and support staff are attending on going workshops to understand and deliver the Berry St Curriculum. Currently across the school we are all learning how to understand our self-regulation skills, this is linked to the general capabilities in the Australian Curriculum. Routines, regulating our movements, and being ready to learn lessons that are being taught now. Teachers will move into developing de-escalation skills with children, to help them understand the stress response and be ready to learn.

Provide a safe, inclusive, and respectful culture

Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL) continues to be a strong theme throughout the school. We are moving to having not only individual DABs but whole class awards for classes that are demonstrating the school values.

Our Drop In Day saw quite a number of families taking the opportunity to visit classrooms and see their children working and lessons progressing. It was very good to see parents in the classroom, some even participated in the activities. We will repeat this next term again in week five.

I'd like to thank the people who gave me their feedback on the UV protection policy. With a few edits, I am asking the SunSmart council to approve and then we will be a SunSmart school. It is good to see more children wearing hats and taking care of their precious skin.

5/6 Camp will be going ahead this year. Mr Smith is finalising details and will be sending out information in the coming weeks.

We didn't get a big response for a 3/4 Camp; we are looking into an alternative option for this year. Next year we will try again.



We exercised our cerebellum and cerebrum through an activity where we wore inertia hats. We needed to concentrate deeply and wonder why we were doing this activity.




