Improve learning and achievement for all students

Transition programs are now in full swing to support our students who will be making the move from preschool to kindergarten next year, as well as for our students who will be venturing off to high school for the next step in their educational pursuits. The preschool students have been enjoying the opportunity to visit Mrs Turtle in the kindergarten classroom each Wednesday, participating in literacy-based learning activities. Mr Smith has been liaising with high schools to coordinate visits before the end of the year. More information will come home to families in the following weeks.

Last week the Year 5/6 students hosted a fabulous Kakadu Fun Day! Kakadu Fun Day is a culmination of a rich financial literacy program where students work through the process of planning, product design, profit and loss projections, promotion, and advertising. Students worked collaboratively to plan, promote, and operate their stalls. All the students' hard work resulted in a fantastic day where fun was had by all, while fundraising for the Year 6 graduation. The Koori Butterflies preschool group continue to learn on Country each fortnight. Next week they will visit the ACT Legislative Assembly to view an art exhibition called, 'The Re-loved Revolution'. The art exhibition is part of National Recycling Week and our Koori Preschool have been working hard on their art pieces which will be on display. Congratulations to Miss James and Aunty Manda for facilitating this opportunity for our students.

Last Tuesday, we sent two 5/6 teams comprising of both boys and girls, to the Tuggeranong Soccer Gala Day. Both teams competed well against several different Tuggeranong schools. The students had a great day out with very positive feedback about the children's fantastic sportsmanship and encouragement other each other. A big thank you to all parents who helped on the day and to Mr. Behrendorff for managing the teams.

Over the coming weeks, students in Year 2-6 will be participating in online PAT testing. PAT tests are a way in which we assess and monitor student growth. Teachers will support students to complete the online assessments, guiding students step by step through the process using the Chromebooks.

On Thursday 23 November, we will be presenting the 2024 Richardson Art Show, transforming our school hall into a spectacular exhibition. All students from Preschool to Year 6 will have artworks on display, showcasing students' developing skills, techniques and processes as they explore a range of forms, styles and mediums. There will be more details to come in the weeks ahead.

Develop an expert teaching team

Teachers have been busy upskilling in the Team Teach program, a professional learning suite which guides teachers to support all students to participate in learning by meeting their needs with positive behaviour support. All teachers and support staff participated in this invaluable professional learning which focuses on safety and de-escalation techniques. As the term progresses, our teachers are busy preparing to report on student learning. Teachers spend a considerable amount of time collecting assessment data, looking at areas of improvement and development for all students.

Student reports are just one way that teachers reflect on and share student achievement. On Wednesday, we again opened our classrooms to families for 'Drop-in' day. Drop-in days allow families to come and see firsthand what teaching and learning looks like in each classroom. Thank you to those family members who were able to come and visit.
