Whats happening in Kindergarten

Our final term of Kindergarten has flown by and with only days to go, we reflect on how much amazing learning we have done this year. Our Kindergarten students work hard each day to display our Richardson values of Respect, Positive Learners who are Safe.

In literacy, we have been fabulous authors and written stories, journal reflections, observations and letters. We are now able to apply our letter sound knowledge in all reading and writing tasks on a daily basis. We have been speakers at assemblies, reading buddies with our peers and listened respectfully to others when they shared their talks during Mystery Bag time.

The focus in numeracy this term has been developing an understanding of numbers, their values and positions up to twenty. We have been great mathematicians, learning how to add and subtract, measure things by weight, mass and volume. We have continued to count the days of school and are excitedly up to day 192, who would have thought we could count that high.

In inquiry this term we have been scientists, making discoveries about living things, their needs and how things grow and change. We participated in the science fair and produced interesting displays, collating the information gathered from our experiments around plants and their needs. Our silkworms have provided us with a living example of the life cycles of creatures. It has been wonderful watching them grow and change and we look forward to seeing them hatch out of their cocoons soon.



In recent weeks we have been discovering what things are made of, exploring different materials and their properties. We have been using our five senses to describe and record these too. This week we designed, made and appraised boats that could float using suitable materials.



We thank every family for their support this year and we look forward to seeing you in the New Year as our Kindergarten friends join year one.

Safe parking behaviours

Unsafe driving and parking behaviours increase the potential road safety risk for children around schools. Road safety is a shared responsibility, it is important the road rules are followed near our school to ensure the entire school community feels safe.

Please remember children are more at risk than adults around schools because they are smaller and less visible to drivers. They are also less predictable and less experienced, which makes them more likely to make errors of judgement.

Failing to follow simple road rules like parking on the verge, in no stopping zones, in bus stops, near children's crossings, on footpaths or across driveways increases the risk to children around schools. Please do the right thing to create a safe environment around our school.



Safe and Supportive Schools

Positive Behaviours for Learning

Many parents and carers will have heard about a program called Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) and wondered what it involves. PBL is a framework that schools use to get everyone – students, staff, families and the school community - on the same page to create a safe and supportive learning environment for all students. As part of the Program, schools create clear expectations and rules using positive language, for example "walk" instead of "don't run". This is done for all areas across the school and everyone involved in the school community. Students and families are involved in this decision-making process. Schools are supported in implementing PBL by an external PBL Coach and Senior Psychologist from the Education Directorate.
