5/6 Kakadu News

Wow! What a busy and exciting Term 3 we have had up in Kakadu. Our students have been engaged in so many interesting learning tasks where they have had opportunities to revise previous learning and experience new things.

In English, 5/6 have been busy perfecting their procedural text writing skills and using them to write up their independent experiments for the Science Fair in week 5. We have now moved onto writing their own picture book narratives in 5/6L and biographical texts in 5/6G. Our students continue to do their Quick Writes for 10 to 15 minutes each day and we have some interesting serials being built on each day that are well worth checking out if you have the time to visit.

In reading, our students revisit and revise the many reading strategies on a regular basis and are finishing off their novel studies from last term after we took a short break to focus on our science projects.



In mathematics, we have been working on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division written strategies. We have also been working with negative numbers and will move onto area, perimeter, volume and capacity this week and finish up the term with symmetry and transformations of 2D shapes.

Our science lessons for the first five weeks of this term have been focussed on conducting and writing up our experiments for the Science Fair. Almost every student in 5/6 worked independently to conduct and write up their experiment using the Scientific Method to enter in the Science Fair. The Kakadu teachers were so proud of the students' efforts and the learning that occurred during this time. If you were not able to attend the Science Fair the projects are still in the classroom if you would like to stop by and have a look.



Our HASS unit this term has been a geographical inquiry into natural disasters. We have read several of Jackie French's picture books on this topic and used the stories told to help us understand how these events not only physically affect the people who are caught up in them, but provide an insight into the emotional toll these events have on people. The students are now working on an individual inquiry of a disaster of their choice and creating a Google slide presentation to demonstrate their learning.

In week 5 our bands took part in combined events with students from Theodore and Taylor Primary schools. Our Year 6 band hosted their event on Thursday afternoon which culminated in a community concert and Mrs Geeves had the pleasure of accompanying the Year 5 band to Taylor Primary on the Friday morning. We have had many other important visits and excursions. We had Constable Kenny visit us in week 6. He told us about the importance of having a family password to keep us safe and about making right and wrong choices. He told us that when we are making responsible choices, we should always ask ourselves are we being kind, are we being safe and are we being healthy. He reminded us of the 3 rules to keep us safe online:

- 1. Ask for permission before logging on
- 2. Stay close to a trusted grown up and
- 3. Don't talk to people we don't know in person.



He also reminded us to wear our helmets when riding our bikes and scooters to school and around the community.

We had our Book Week celebrations at the end of week 7.



And the highlight of the term was our On Country learning day at Tidbinbilla last Tuesday to celebrate NAIDOC Week.
